Limited Government Subsidies for Small Organizations



Federal Tax Credit

Created by the federal health care reform law. Worth **up to 25%** of the premium paid by tax-exempt employers now, **35% in 2014**. Credits are on a sliding scale, based on average wage and number of employees.

To qualify, an employer must:

- Cover at least 50% of the premium for individual coverage for some of its workers
- Have fewer than the equivalent of 25 full-time workers
- Pay average annual wages below \$50,000



Wellness Track

Wellness Track offers a subsidy worth **up to 15%** of the employer's contributions for a Business Express plan from the Health Connector.

- Must meet the federal size and salary requirements (see prior slide).
- At least 33% of the employees must have a **preventative care visit** within the year.
- The employer must also make a change to **promote** wellness in the workplace.

Wellness Track offers **online tools** for employees to set and track personal health and wellness goals.



Massachusetts Insurance Partnership

Helps employers of \leq **50 full-time employees** pay for health coverage for uninsured lower-wage employees.

Participating employers receive money **monthly** to help cover the cost of an employee's coverage.

Employer subsidies are capped at **\$400** a year for individual coverage, **\$800** for dual coverage and **\$1000** for family coverage.

Income-eligible **employees also receive subsidies** for their share of the premium, up to **\$150** each for an employee and spouse, **\$227** per child.



Business Express

Business Express – commercial health plans from participating Commonwealth Choice insurers.

- For employers with ≤50 eligible employees
- Must contribute at least 50% toward the premium for an individual and 33% for dependents
- Must meet employee participation requirements.

Employee Options

MassHealth, the state's Medicaid program, has a premium assistance program for people who qualify.

Commonwealth Care and Commonwealth Choice **are not available** to people who are offered ESI.*

* Some small exceptions apply, based on the quality of the coverage and the size of the employer contribution.
